## **GPRS/CDMA Communication Protocol**

This document describes the communication protocol between Kingwo GPS terminal and backend.

This protocol document is applicable all terminal models which are produced by Kingwo, the users could select the relative protocol according to the terminal model difference and then integrate.

Wired terminal: MT01/MT02S/MT08/MT03/WT01/LT01/LT03/NT01 (Although MT03 and LT03 is a wireless model, but since it is a real time terminal and can connect a cable, so it is included in the list of wired terminals)

Wireless terminal: MT06/MT07/MT09/WT26/WT27/NT06E

1.1.2 Storage properties 1byte,0x31:indicates needs to be stored; 0x30:indicates no need to be stored ;

1.1.3 Response properties 1byte,0x31: **Indicates need response** ; 0x30:No need response ; The response properties of response data is fixed to 0x30;

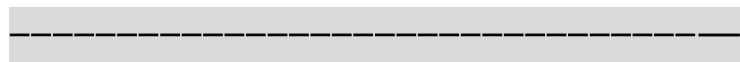
